Our focus for this period was to have the children become independent. They are now able to change into slippers, put away their lunch boxes and start the day without any tears. The



INFORMATION CHANGES: Please notify the school office at 301-962-7262 or MargaritaSBMA@yahoo.com if there are phone number, address, appointment and/or pickup changes.

CARPOOL LINE: For the safety for all involved, please remember to stay in your vehicle during carpool. Our teachers will assist your children from your car to our doors and vice versa. When possible, please have your child seated on the passenger side of your vehicle.

LATE ARRIVAL: Please do your best to bring your child to school on time. Late arrivals throw off your child's day and interrupt the classroom. **Students in the first Foreign Language class must arrive by 9am** to join their class; otherwise, they will go directly to the Montessori class and miss foreign language for that day.

OUTDOOR PLAY: The Maryland Department of Education requires that we provide "full-day" students with outdoor activities on a daily basis. We believe that children need time outdoors except when it rains or the temperature falls below 35 degrees. Please dress your children appropriately for the weather.

LUNCH TIME: Remember to pack 2 napkins and utensils (if needed) with your child's healthy lunch.

RETURNING TO SCHOOL AFTER ILLNESS: Children may not return to school until their temperature has been normal for at least 24 hrs following an illness. A doctor's note is required if your child has been absent or sent home due to: Any Communicable Disease, Unexplained Rash, Discharge from the Eye or Other Signs of Pink Eye (24 hrs after initial dose of antibiotics.

PAYMENT REMINDER: Payments are due by the first of the month. A 3% late fee will be assessed to accounts 30-days past due, and will accrue monthly until **all** payments are made.

BIRTHDAY PARTIES: We love honoring each child's birthday with a song and special snack (no party favors or gifts, please). Call the office to schedule your child's celebration & let us know if you can attend.
